Effective 1 December 2015 the CCR program will be aligned with the employeridentified skills depicted in the PMI Talent Triangle to ensure PMI certification holders are equipped to remain relevant in a continually changing business environment.

 The total number of PDUs required to maintain an active certification status will not change; the way PDUs are classified will change. Please refer to the <u>infographics</u> for details.

Important Info About PMP[®] Exam Changes

- The PMP[®] Exam is changing. The last day for the current exam is 1 November 2015. After 1 November 2015, only the new version of the PMP[®] exam will be administered.
- The five domains of practice for the PMP remain the same. However, tasks within each domain have been modified, added, or removed. There is an addition of 8 new tasks.
- To view all the changes in detail, see the **Exam Content Outline**.
- Important Note: This is not the final version of the new PMP[®] Exam Content Outline. The proportion of questions from each domain that will appear on the exam has not yet been determined. Additionally, the knowledge and skills associated with each of these domains and tasks is not included. This information will be available no later than 15 June 2015.
